SB 1560

Brief summary

Replaces the term "alien" with "noncitizen" in various statutes.

Analysis

What the law currently does

Many statutes use the term "alien" to denote a person who is not a citizen or national of the United States.

What will change if the bill is enacted

SB 1560 defines "noncitizen" as an individual who is not a citizen or national of the United States. The bill replaces the word "alien" with "noncitizen" in 11 different chapters (15 different sections) of the Oregon Revised Statutes.

SB 1560 requires state agencies to use the word "noncitizen" in rule and to amend existing rules to remove the word "alien" no later than six months after the law becomes effective (January 1, 2023).

Likely impacts, results, or consequences if the bill is enacted

Two of the sections amended by the bill are in the workers' compensation law, ORS 656.005 and 656.232. Both sections are in relation to who qualifies as a beneficiary or a dependent of the worker. The change in terminology and the new definition will not have a substantive effect on the workers' compensation law or the Workers' Compensation Division's administration of the law.
