First study in 1986

WC Climate in mid-1980s

- Oregon was known to be among states with the highest WC costs in the nation
- Oregon had high rates of occupational injury and illness
- Oregon experienced double-digit premium rate increases

Study Goals

- Produce a fair comparison of premiums with respect to industry mix
- Include all 50 states plus D.C.
- Report findings within the study year

Rate Ranking Methodology

- Find a representative set of occupations/industries
- Survey 51 US jurisdictions' voluntary market premium rates by class
- Calculate manual premium rates for each class in each jurisdiction
 Pure premium x LCM x Taxes and Assessments
- Adjust these premiums by Oregon payroll
- Calculate each jurisdiction's index rate


$$\frac{\Sigma (payroll * premium rate)}{\Sigma (payroll)}$$

Range of Index Rates from 51 Jurisdictions 1988-2022



Least costly jurisdictions

- Bottom quartile of Index Rates in 2022 (13 jurisdictions)
- All less than 78 percent of the median
- Oregon rose in the ranking despite lower index rate (45th to 42nd)
- Colorado is new to this quartile
- Tennessee has moved up

Middle ground

- Second and third quartiles of index rates in 2022 (25 jurisdictions)
- Between 77 and 120 percent of the median
- There were 14 jurisdictions within 10% of the median

- Top quartile of Index Rates in 2022 (13 jurisdictions)
- All greater than 121 percent of the median
- Wyoming, Maine, Minnesota and Missouri are all new to this group
